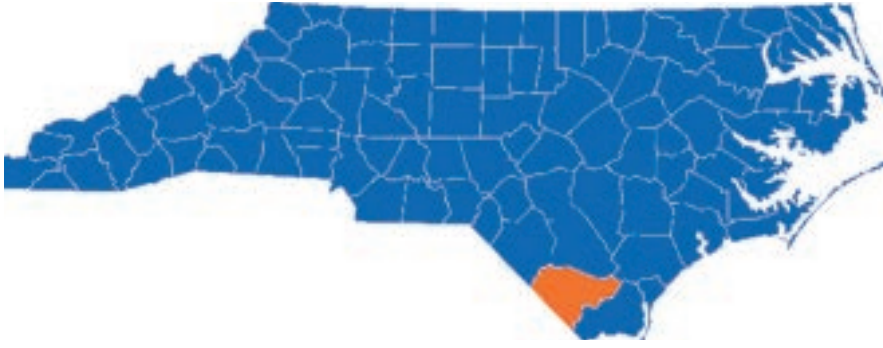

I want to also recognize the great work of faculty and staff. They have been unwavering in their commitment to support our students during the pandemic.

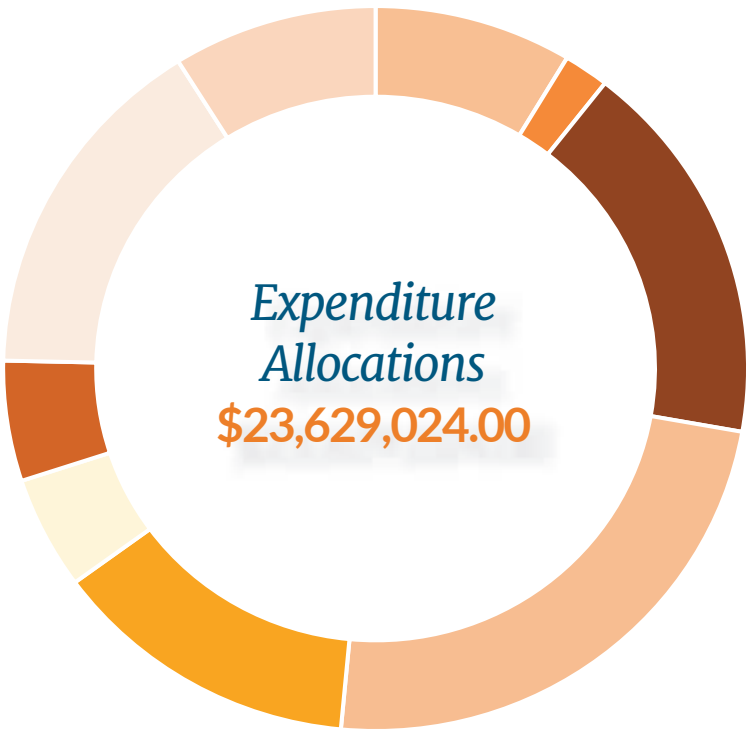
As we begin a new year with our

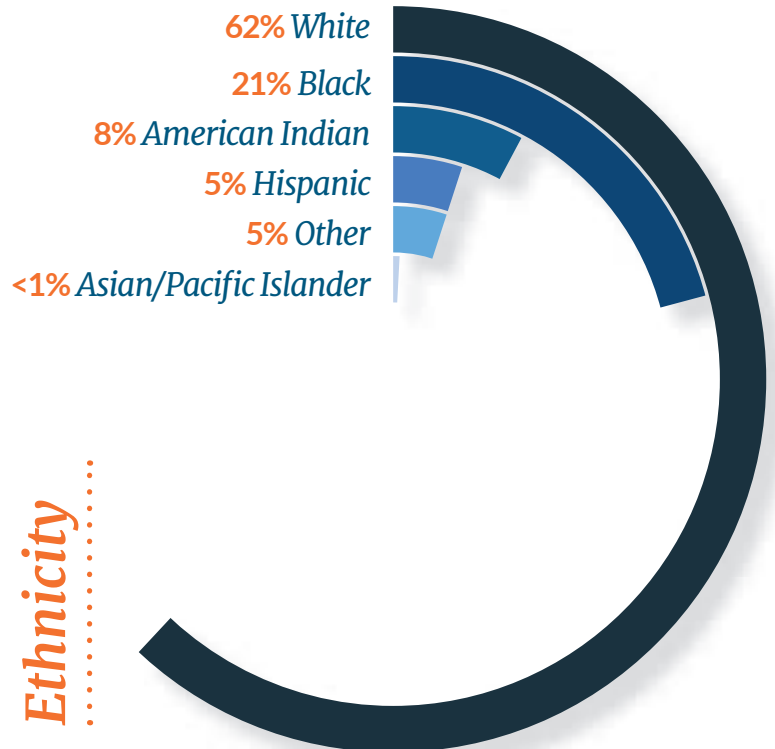
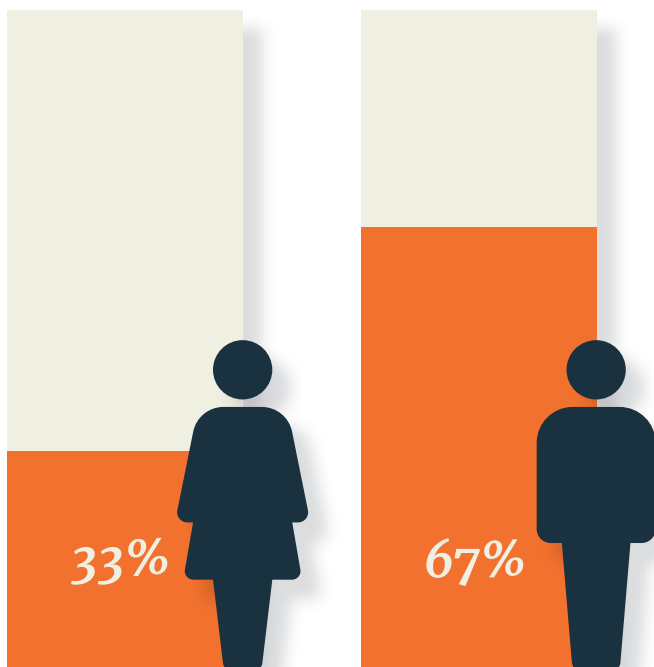

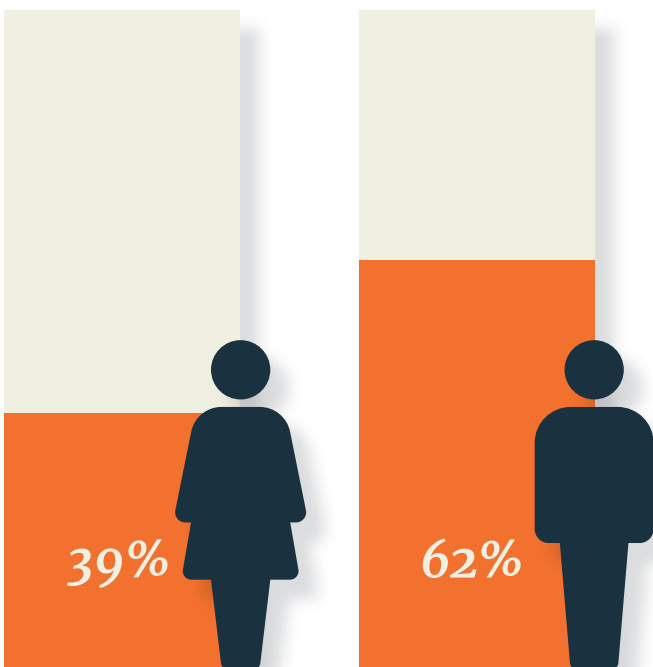

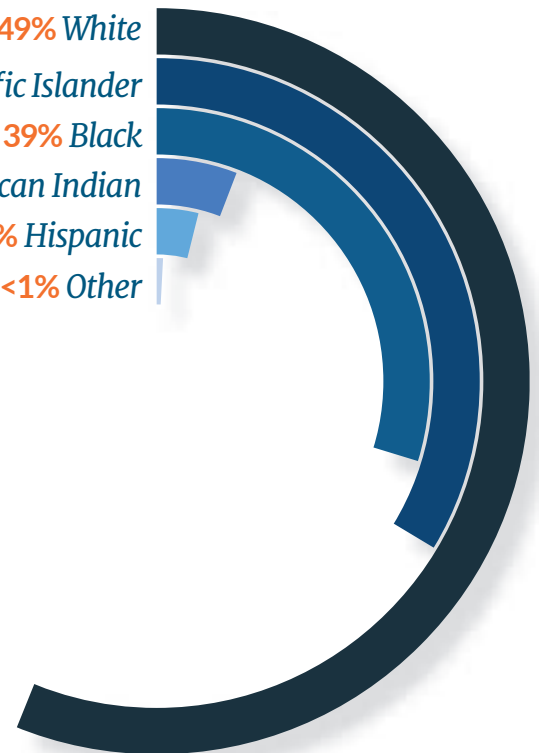

Programs

Agribusiness Technology

Agribusiness Technology program prepares students to manage agricultural businesses and related operations withing diversified agriculture corporations.

Teacher Preparation

To address the teacher shortage in Columbus County and NC, SCC is offering an A.S. and A.A. in Teacher Preparation. The program is designed so students can complete their first two years at SCC then transfer smoothly to a university to complete their bachelor's degree, which is a requirement to become a certified teacher.

East Carolina University Transfer Agreement

SCC has established university transfer partnerships with North Carolina institutions to ensure guaranteed admission to qualifying students. In Fall of 2019, SCC secured a partnership with East Carolina University through the Pirate Promise program.

Pirate Promise: a transfer program agreement with ECU and SCC. Students in their first year of coursework at SCC may apply to ECU for Pirate Promise. Accepted students are guaranteed admission to ECU after completing an approved associate degree.

The agreement is also filled with rewarding ECU student benefits. Other universities include Gardner-Webb University, UNC Pembroke, and UNC Wilmington.



Advanced Manufacturing Training Center

The new Advanced Manufacturing Training Center opened in Spring 2020. The center is an expansion of the T-Building and includes training areas, classrooms, offices and a meeting space.

After hearing from local industry partners that this type of training is what they will be looking for when hiring future employees, it was essential to build this new facility.

The training floor is for students in the Mechatronics and Electrical Engineering Technology programs, along with Workforce training programs.

GOING VIRTUAL

Although we shut our doors to the public for safety of our community, we took classes online and trained employees to Virtually assist Students. SCC also provided Chromebooks to students.



IT ENHANCEMENT

Expanded WiFi hotspot areas around campus for students to use in parking lots at a safe social distance. Provided multiple software and technology updates for both students employees so that SCC could maximizes surface offerings.



CARES ACT FUND

Students that were enrolled in the Spring + Summer 2020 semesters received additional federal aid through CARES Act Relief.



DONATION OF ESSENTIAL MEDICAL SUPPLIES

SCC donated personal protection equipment (PPE) used for student classes and trainings. Items that were in high demand across the country and needed in Columbus County were collected and taken to Columbus County Emergency Services and Columbus County Regional Healthcare System.



ONLINE HELP

As a campus that operated face-to-face, when COVID hit we took our help desk online creating a way for students to receive assistance through online chat services, virtual advising appointments, helpline support and more.



GRADUATION

We celebrated over 1,000 graduates from SCC and Columbus County high schools that worked hard and persevered through uncontrollable circumstances.



SHOP ONLINE

The SCC Bookstore launched online access for students to purchase books and other supplies.

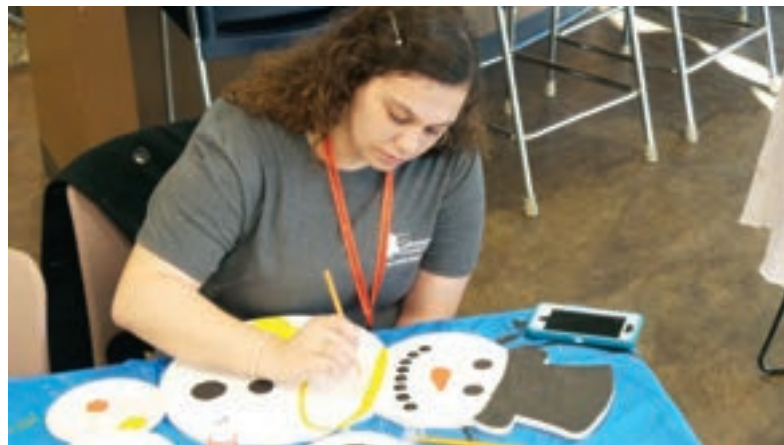

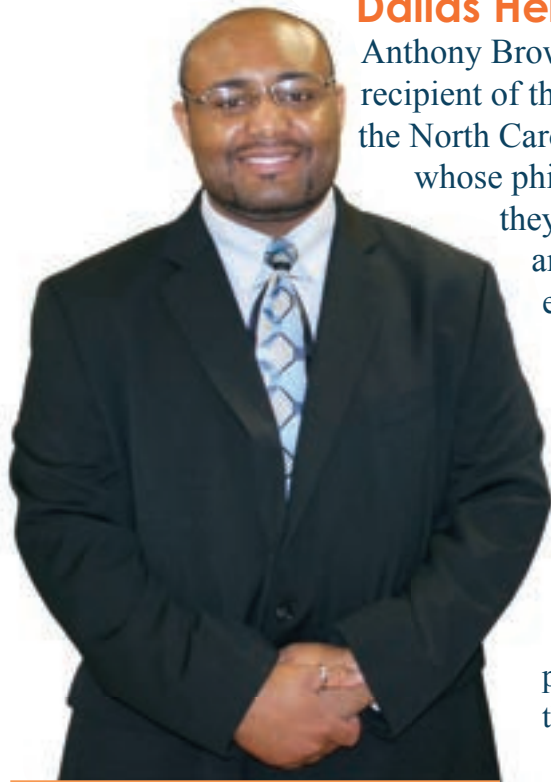

Student Awards

Dallas Herring Achievement Award

Anthony Brown is the Southeastern Community College nominee and state level recipient of the Dallas Herring Achievement Award. The award is established by the North Carolina Community College System to honor late Dr. Dallas Herring whose philosophy of “taking people where they are and carrying them as far as they can go” is the guiding principle of the system. The award is given annually to a current or former community college student who best embodies Dr. Herring’s philosophy.



Anthony graduated in May 2020 with an Associate of Science in Mechatronics Engineering Technology. In his application he wrote, “I’m no stranger to hardships. I attended SCC during high school as an Early College students but didn’t think I would return as a traditional student. I was all set to attend UNC-Pembroke (UNCP). In 2016, Hurricane Matthew struck my home, bringing flood waters that caused damage beyond comprehension. The flooding caused my aunt and I to lose our home, along with all of our possessions. The recovery process had a severe impact on my academic progress at UNCP. Due to the burden of finances and losing everything in the hurricane, I dropped out, leading to financial debt. I knew that education was important so I enrolled at SCC in 2018.

While we were still trying to get our lives back together, we were hit by another catastrophic hurricane. My home flooded again – this time by Hurricane Florence. The storm caused more devastation and, again, we lost our home and possessions we had replaced from Hurricane Matthew. We were forced to relocate to Charlotte.

Even though there was so

much to deal with – loss of our home, possessions, my school books and supplies, homeless - I knew I couldn’t let this overtake me. I also knew that if I had dropped out of my classes at SCC, I would have lost my financial aid, leading to more debt. I started calling SCC to inform them of my situation. I wanted to make sure my instructors and Student Services knew where I was and found myself desperate for help. My aunt and I were relocated back to Fair Bluff and I was finally able to return to SCC.

When I returned, I had a stronger sense of resolve and wanted to help others on campus who had gone through what I experienced. I began volunteering on campus with SGA. I was determined to be proactive to ensure success in my life. SGA established a Pantry for students and employees who were struggling – just like me.

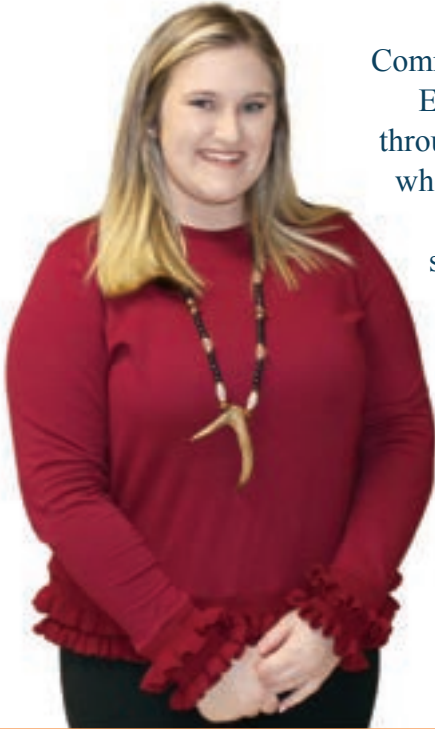
Without clothes, home, or transportation, with the help of God and faculty and staff at SCC, I managed to receive the aid I needed to get back on track. I’m now secretary of SGA, a work-study and tutor on campus. I participate in Skills-USA and recently made the Dean’s list.

I’m thankful for what I’ve overcome. The first disaster brought me to SCC and the second pushed me to become someone I never thought I would be. Dr. Dallas Herring’s philosophy of “taking people where they are and carrying them as far as they can go” describes my journey perfectly. I’m doing things I never envisioned myself doing.”
